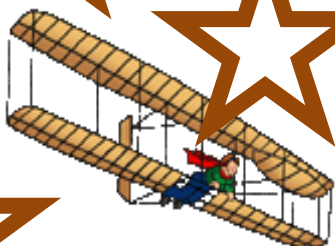


Active or passive?
