

REPORTED SPEECH - 2nd part



When we want to report what someone said, we can use **“direct speech”** or **“reported speech”**

DIRECT SPEECH → we give the exact words that the speaker said, and we use quotation marks (“...”)

Charles said, “Did you meet your mother here yesterday?”

REPORTED SPEECH → we refer to what a person has said previously. We usually change:

- **Pronouns** I → HE My → HIS
- **Verb tenses** met → HAD MET
- **Times** yesterday → THE PREVIOUS DAY
- **Places** here → THERE

Charles asked IF he had met his mum the previous day there



Tenses, adjectives, pronouns, etc. in **reported questions** change in the **same way** as in reported statements (*look at charts in REPORTED SPEECH – 1st PART*)

*Some examples:

DIRECT SPEECH VERB	EXAMPLE	INDIRECT SPEECH VERB	EXAMPLE
PRESENT SIMPLE	“How is your mother?”, she asked	PAST SIMPLE	She asked how my mother was
PRESENT CONTINUOUS	“What are you doing ?”, they asked	PAST CONTINUOUS	They asked what we were doing
PAST SIMPLE	He asked me “ Did you write two letters to her?”	PAST SIMPLE/ PAST PERFECT	*He asked if I wrote two letters to her *He asked if I had written two letters to her

SPEAKER'S WORD → → **REPORTED SPEECH**

- “Will you go to the party?” He asked me if I _____ to the party.
- “How old are the twins?” She asked how old the twins _____.

IMPORTANT !!

In **REPORTED QUESTIONS**:

He asked: "Does she live in Edinburgh?" → He asked whether she lived in Edinburgh

The **word order** is the same as in statements

He asked whether she lived in Edinburgh

Subject + verb

✗ We do not use the **auxiliary verb**

He asked whether she ✗ lived in Edinburgh

! Except in **NEGATIVE QUESTIONS**. Look at:

"Who ~~doe~~n't like coffee?" → She asked me who **didn't like** coffee

✗ We do not use **question marks** (?)

He asked whether she lived in Edinburgh ✗

★ ★ ★ ★ ★ ★ ★ ★ ★ ★

She asked him if he was all right after so much time lost in the jungle...

YES / NO QUESTIONS

- This type of questions is reported by using **"ASK"**
"Do you speak French?" → He **asked** me if I spoke French
"Were you watching TV?" → They **asked** if I was watching TV
- We use **IF / WHETHER** to introduce yes / no reported questions
"Are you Spanish or Portuguese?" → She asked **if** he was Spanish or Portuguese
"Are you English or Scottish?" → She asked **whether** he was English or Scottish



WH- QUESTIONS

- This type of questions is reported by using **"ASK"**
"Where did you go yesterday?" → He **asked** me where I went the other day
"Who has phoned?" → I **asked** my mother who had phoned
- We use **WH- QUESTIONS WORDS** to introduce wh- reported questions
"What is your name?" he asked me → He asked me **what** my name was
"When can we meet again?" I asked him → I asked him **when** we could meet again

REMEMBER!

Wh – question words are:

*WHAT	*WHERE	*WHEN
*WHY	*WHO	*WHICH
*WHOSE	*WHOM
