SIMPLE PRESENT – SIMPLE PAST

- am / is (not) ⇒ was (not)
- are (not) ⇒ were (not)
- wash / washes ⇒ washed
- **don't / doesn't** wash ⇒ **didn't** wash
- see / sees ⇒ saw
- **don't / doesn't** see ⇒ **didn't** see

SIMPLE PAST – PAST PERFECT

- washed ⇒ had washed
- **didn't** wash ⇒ **hadn't** washed
- saw ⇒ had seen
- **didn't** see ⇒ **hadn't** seen

PRESENT PERFECT – PAST PERFECT

- has / have washed ⇒ had washed
- **hasn't / haven't** wash ⇒ **hadn't** washed
- has / have seen ⇒ had seen
- **hasn't / haven't** seen ⇒ **hadn't** seen

Examples:

simple present ⇒ simple past:

What do you do? ⇒ She asked me *what I did*.
 Where does she study? ⇒ She asked *where she studied*.

present continuous ⇒ past continuous:

When are you leaving? ⇒ She asked him *when he was leaving*.

simple past ⇒ past perfect:

What did you learn? ⇒ She asked him *what he had learned*.
