REPORTED SPEECH - 1st part

When we want to report what someone said, we can use "direct speech" or "reported speech"

DIRECT \$PEECH \rightarrow we give the <u>exact words</u> that the speaker said, and we use <u>quotation marks</u> ("...")

Charles said, "I met my mum yesterday here"

REPORTED SPEECH \rightarrow we refer to what a person has said previously. We usually change:

• **Pronouns** $I \rightarrow HE$ My $\rightarrow HIS$

Verb tenses met → HAD MET

Times yesterday → THE PREVIOUS DAY

• **Places** here → THERE

Charles said THAT he had met his mum the previous day there

Statements are usually reported with a past tense verb and an optional THAT. All tenses that follow move back into the past.
