

Conditionals

Types of conditionals :

<p>Zero conditional</p> <p>Form: If + Simple Present, Simple Present</p> <p>Example: if you heat water to a 100c°, it boils</p>	→	General truth
<p>First Conditional</p> <p>Form: If+ Simple Present, Simple Future</p> <p>Example: if students work hard, they will succeed.</p>	→	Real,Present/Future
<p>Second Conditional</p> <p>Form: If+ Simple Past, would+ present infinitive</p> <p>Example: if I were rich, I would buy an ipad.</p>	→	Imaginary in the present, unreal
<p>Third Conditional</p> <p>Form: If+ Past Perfect, would + perfect infinitive</p> <p>Example: If Sarah had gone to school, she wouldn't have missed several lessons.</p>	→	Imaginary in the past
