(1) In 1961, when Andrew Lloyd Webber was 13 years old, a new musical called *The Sound of Music* came to London. Webber wrote a fan letter to Richard Rodgers, the composer of the musical, and Rodgers answered and asked Webber to meet him at the theatre. He gave him a ticket for the opening performance. It was the first opening night that Webber went to, and he has never forgotten it. (A)

(2) 45 years later, Webber had the idea of doing a new production of *The Sound of Music*. He wanted to find the perfect actress to play the lead, and chose a new and very interesting way of discovering his Maria: he organized a TV talent search. Some experts helped him to choose ten young women. Not all of them were professional singers or dancers, but they sang live every Saturday on a BBC talent show. The programme was a big hit and after eight



weeks, two million people voted for their favourite Maria, Connie Fisher. Webber preferred Connie, too. His *The Sound of Music* production opened in November 2006 at the London Palladium. It was a big success and made Connie Fisher a star. **(B)**

- (3) Lord Andrew Lloyd Webber is now the best-known composer of musicals of our time. His musical *Cats* has become famous all over the world. It opened at the New London Theatre in 1981, and it has been performed in more than 26 countries and 300 cities. There have been more than 8,900 performances in London alone.
- (4) The story behind the musical is simple. Once a year at midnight, there is a big ball where some cats meet to look back on their lives. They sing beautiful songs, which are based on poems written by T.S. Eliot. The stage is covered in rubbish. It's the perfect playground for cats: there are old chairs, ropes and large bottles, all of which are six times bigger than in real life to make the cats look smaller. The audience usually enjoys the fantastic music, including the famous song *Memory*, the marvellous costumes and the spectacular jazz dance show. (C)
- (5) Webber's most successful musical to date is *The Phantom of the Opera*, which first opened at Her Majesty's Theatre in London's West End in 1986. It celebrated its 9,000th performance in 2008. It is also the longest-running musical on Broadway in New York. (D)
- (6) The story is based on the book by the French writer Gaston Leroux. It's about Erik the musician, who is known as the Opera Ghost. He lives in the cellars and tunnels under the Paris Opera House in the 19th century. His face is deformed*, so he hides it behind a white mask and usually keeps away from people. He loves the young singer Christine, so when Christine falls in love with Raoul, the opera house manager, Erik is heartbroken and upset. But Christine would rather live with Raoul.
- (7) Andrew Lloyd Webber's other musicals include Jesus Christ Superstar (1971), Evita (1978), Starlight Express (1984), Sunset Boulevard (1993), and The Woman in White (2004). (E)
