CONDITIONALS

1st Conditional: The Real Present (possible & probable)

If + present tense → will / can / may + infinitive

If it rains, we'll stay at home but if the sun shines, we'll have a picnic. (it might happen) She'll have bad marks if she doesn't study.

2nd Conditional: The Unreal Present (improbable; also used to give advice)

If + past simple --> would / could / might + infinitive



If she **had** a lot of money, she'd buy a sports car. (untrue in the present)

He'd paint his flat if he had time (But he doesn't have time so he hasn't)

If I were you, I'd see a doctor. (giving advice) We use were for all cases

3rd Conditional: The Unreal Past (impossible in the past)

If + past perfect → would / could / might + have + past participle

! Past prefect = had + past participle !



If you had told me, I would've helped you. (it didn't happen in the past)

She would've passed the exams if she had studied.

Unless = if not

If you don't water the flowers, they'll die. =

Unless you water the flowers, they'll die.
